## CJ HURLEY CENTURY ARTS STUDIO CPMES TO DENVER IN JANUARY 2018



## Keynote Présentation

Artistic Couples of the Arts & Crafts Movement: Frances MacDonald & Herbert McNair and Carl & Karin Larsson Sat. Jan. 20, 2018 | 6:30 - 8:00pm at Boettcher Mansion

When CJ lectures about the Arts & Crafts period, it's always in terms of it being one of the most influential art movements in international art history. Not since the Renaissance has there been such a far-reaching artistic legacy, the impact of which not only led to modernism, but the reverberations from the Arts & Crafts Movement that are still felt in the world today.

This well illustrated talk highlights two teams of Artist Collaborators; the McNairs and the Larssons. They were partners who helped shape the form the Arts & Crafts Movement took in their respective nations. Herbert McNair & Frances MacDonald: A Scottish art couple better known in their role as members of Glasgow's The Four. Carl & Karin Larsson: A team best known for bringing a recognizable identity to Swedish National Design, and for acting as the springboard for Swedish Modernism.

Attendees to this talk at other annual Arts & Crafts conferences have gained a broader understanding of the significance of the movement in general and a deeper knowledge of the work of the featured artists/designers. CJ presents in a manner that makes information accessible to those who are newly discovering Arts & Crafts, but also in-depth and informative to be engaging for those well versed in the history of the movement.

## Color & Painting Education & Convultation

#### **Professional Color Workshop**

Saturday, Jan. 20, 2018 | 3-4pm at Boettcher Mansion In this well illustrated one-hour presentation, Barbara Pierce will share information she regularly imparts to her color consultation clients. She will discuss the importance of understanding architecture and proper placement of color for exterior painting. She will present practical information, which attendees can easily translate to their own projects.

Barbara will offer tips and ideas to think about when selecting colors for your own home, touching on the idea of honoring the history of the house while also respecting the personality and wishes of its modern day owners. The talk concludes with a summary of information home and building owners need to know when interviewing painters and reviewing bids, as well as tips for achieving the desired results in the completed project.

The focus of this presentation is on exteriors with photographs emphasizing a variety of Arts & Crafts homes. However, other historic periods and styles will be represented. The practical tips and advice for selecting color, understanding color placement and choosing a painter will be valuable for owners of any home style and age. 

Art and life are part of a greater whole, and I strive to bring high quality art back into people's lives, where they can interact with it intimately and make it an enriching part of their daily life.

My art and design work is rooted in the desire to reclaim art as a way of life, to bring art back into the home where it can be fully enjoyed. The contemporary art world has become too lofty and disconnected from our lives, and art isn't lived with anymore. It has been relegated to museum collections and galleries; this forces people to have to visit a specialized institution in order to spend time with art. This is unfortunate because art is one of the essential joys of life. The understanding that architecture and the applied arts are of equal importance to the human environment inspires me as an artist. My desire is to find a way to seamlessly incorporate art into our living environments, where life and art are not separate from one another, but are a holistic one.

My journey as an artist has been subtly unfolding like a flower. For years my paintings centered on social, spiritual, and gender issues. The iconography of Japanese Ukiyo-e prints, western and eastern goddess mythology, religious studies, and eastern philosophy informed and explained my work, and I was compelled to apply philosophical and spiritual insight to an exploration of the chaos inherent in the world. Yet there was one idea that I couldn't reconcile with painting alone – the ideal of art and life united as one. This unification I felt held the key to inner peace and contentment

in a world of chronic violence, war and disorder. Drawn to the writings and philosophy of Japanese art critic, Okakura Kakuzo [1862-1913] I began to explore art as not merely paintings on canvas, the creation of objects, but as environment – as an extension of where and how we live. I began to explore my own artistic vision with art as a way of life. I found it in the revolutionary idea that all art [architecture, fine and applied arts] are of equal importance to the human environment. Therefore, I began exploring the integration of architecture, the arts (painting, sculpture, textiles, ceramics, metalwork, and furnishings), and the natural environment as a seamless whole.

The integration of the arts with life offers the opportunity to bring the highest ideals, values, and philosophical ideas that art has to offer into everyday activity. While the life and art relationship can readily be seen in the interiors I've created, I apply the same values and ideals to all of my work, whether it is a painting, a piece of pottery, metalwork, or any other medium.
